## BOARD MEETING

NOVEMBER 18, 2010

### MINUTES

The New Mexico Junior College Board met on Thursday, November 18, 2010, beginning at 4:00 p.m. in the Zia Room of Pannell Library. The following members were present: Ms. Patricia Chappelle, Secretary; Mrs. Mary Lou Vinson; Mr. Phillip Jones; Mr. Ron Black; and Mr. Guy Kesner. Not present was Mrs. Yvonne Williams.

Ms. Chappelle called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and guests present: Beth Hahn, News-Sun.

Upon a motion by Mr. Jones, seconded by Mrs. Vinson, the agenda was unanimously adopted.

Upon a motion by Mr. Kesner, seconded by Mr. Jones, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of October 21, 2010.

*Under Presidents Report*, Dr. McCleery congratulated Calvin Smith on the recent mammoth remains found in Lea County. He informed the Board that SunEdison have pulled their project due to the fact they did not get the bid. The Christmas Banquet is scheduled for December 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6:30 pm. Robert Rhodes gave an update on the New Mexico Junior College Energy Training Center, including potential partnerships.

*Under New Business*, Dan Hardin presented the October financial reports and with a motion by Mrs. Vinson, seconded by Mr. Black, the Board unanimously approved the expenditures for October, 2010. Upon a motion by Mr. Kesner, seconded by Mr. Black, the Board unanimously approved the Fiscal Watch Reports.

Mr. Hardin requested approval to submit the Budget Adjustment Request to the State reflecting the reduction of the State appropriation by \$225,300, as well as

increasing the budget in local mill levy property funding by \$225,300. Upon a motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mrs. Vinson, the Board unanimously approved the requests.

Dr. McCleery presented a request from the City of Hobbs for \$150,000 to help cover the cost of the Millen Drive Utility Extensions. The funds will be taken from the Capital Projects account. Upon a motion by Mr. Kesner, seconded by Mrs. Vinson, the Board unanimously approved the request with the stipulation that anyone who utilizes the line within 10 years of the completion of the project will be required to pay a prorated share to New Mexico Junior College.

Ms. Chappelle called for comments from the public. There being none, the next regular board meeting was scheduled for Thursday, December 16, 2010, beginning at 4:00 p.m.


Mr. Black moved the board go into closed session for the discussion of limited personnel matters under the provisions of section 10-15-1-H (2) of the New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1078. Mrs. Vinson seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follows: Mr. Jones - yes; Ms. Chappelle - yes; Mr. Black - yes; Mr. Kesner - yes; Mrs. Vinson - yes.

Upon re-convening in open meeting, Ms. Chappelle stated that the matters discussed in the closed meeting were limited only to those specified in the motion for closure.


Upon a motion by Mr. Jones, seconded by Mrs. Vinson, the board meeting adjourned.

**RE: Expenditure and Revenue Reports for November**

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November is month five or 42 percent of the 2010/2011 fiscal year. The expenditure report reflects expenditure totals that include funds expended and encumbered. The total year-to-date funds expended and/or encumbered through November 2010 is \$19,927,301.00.

In the November expense report the total Current Unrestricted year-to-date subtotal is \$9,302,618.00, which is 43% of the budget. The expenses in Instruction and General are \$540,150.00 less than FY 10 due to the changes made last December in personnel contracts. Most other areas of expenditures are normal for this time of year, although the percentage for the Internal Services Department is high. The Internal Services Department, which is mainly the Computer Service Department, has a high percentage of budget expended due to maintenance agreements encumbered. Each month there is a credit to the Computer Services department from Instruction, Academic Support, Student Services, and Institutional Support as mandated by the Higher Education Department. At the end of the fiscal year this should be back to the budgeted amount. The other unrestricted funds have normal expenditures for this time of year.

In the restricted funds, Grant spending is at 46% of the budget. In the restricted Student Aid, the Financial Aid department has been working in getting Pell and Student loans ready. We will see the expense for these in December and January. Total expenditures for restricted funds are \$3,640,702.00.

Plant fund expenditures for the month are \$1,092,826.00, the total year-to-date with encumbrances is \$6,983,981.00. The expenditures for the month are mostly the encumbrance of the Warehouse project, along with several other small institutional projects. There was a correction in the General Fund in November, causing a credit for the month.

Total expenditures and encumbrances through November 2010 is \$19,927,301.00, which is 43% of the budget.

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The Revenue remains positive even though the State has made cuts in the State appropriation. Tuition and fees are up this year, State Appropriations are down by \$775,132.00, and other revenues are up. Other revenues include the \$416,126.00 that Dr. Rhodes secured from the State for the Oil and Gas Training area. Total unrestricted revenue thru November is \$9,850,159.00. Auxiliary Enterprises revenue is up at this time compared to last year, with the total Auxiliary Enterprise revenue of \$1,355,129.00. The revenue for the restricted funds is staying current with the expenditures for grants and restricted financial aid.

The year-to-date Revenue for November 2010 is \$13,249,206.00.

The Oil and Gas report shows the actual Oil and Gas revenue for July through September, and the accrual of \$366,666.00 for October and November. During the first three months of actual Oil and Gas revenue, we are \$796,443.00 over budget. We anticipate that we will receive Oil and Gas Equipment Tax revenue in December. Also, we normally will receive a large check for Mill Levy property tax in December or January.

The Investment report reflects the \$9,625,000.00 invested with LGIP. \$9,589,592.05 are funds that the College can draw, \$35,407.95 are still considered reserve contingency funds. Interest is being paid on the reserve contingency funds.

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PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a New Mexico Junior College Board election shall be held in two of the seven voting districts, Lea County, New Mexico, on Tuesday, the 1st day of March, 2011 at which time there shall be submitted for vote to the qualified, registered elector of the District, the following matter:

**The term of office for two board positions on the New Mexico Junior College Board shall expire on April 1, 2011. It is necessary that an election take place to fill these positions. The term of office for District 4 Board Member is six years. The term of office for District 5 is two years to fulfill an unexpired term.**

The polls for said election will be opened at 7:00 a.m. on the day of said election and will be closed at 7:00 p.m. Precincts shall be consolidated for this election. The polling place for the consolidated precincts (such polling place being located within the consolidated precinct) is as follows:

A map of the district is available for inspection at the President's Office, New Mexico Junior College or in the office of the County Clerk.

Each voter shall cast his or her ballot in the precinct and district for which he or she resides and is currently registered and for the candidate of that district.

Residents of the New Mexico Junior College District living in the above district who are qualified electors of the State of New Mexico, shall be eligible to become a candidate to serve as a member of the New Mexico Junior College Board and shall file a declaration of candidacy on the form prescribed by law for the district in which they reside with the County Clerk of Lea County, Lea County Courthouse, Lovington, New Mexico on the 48th day before the election, January 12, 2011, commencing at 9:00 a.m. and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the same day.

No ballot on the Board Member election shall be received by any polling place board unless the person offering to vote is a registered, qualified elector of the District.

Residents of the New Mexico Junior College District who are qualified electors of the State of New Mexico and residents of the district for which they desire to become write-in candidate as a member of the New Mexico Junior College Board shall file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate on the form prescribed by law with the County Clerk of Lea County, Lea County Courthouse, Lovington, New Mexico, before 5:00 p.m. on the 35th day before the election, January 25, 2011.

The registration books of Lea County shall be closed by the County Clerk at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 1, 2011. Any person otherwise eligible to vote as a qualified elector and not currently registered, may register prior to such time at the city clerk's office or in the office of the County Clerk.

Voting machines shall be used for this Board Member election.

Absentee voting shall be at the Office of the County Clerk, Lea County Courthouse, Lovington, New Mexico during the regular hours and days of business beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, February 4, 2011, and ending at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 25, 2011. Absentee ballots can be obtained from the Office of the County Clerk, Lea County, New Mexico.

Any information concerning absentee ballots, polling places, or any other matters relating to the election can be obtained from the Office of the County Clerk, Lea County, New Mexico.


