BOARD MEETING

APRIL 15, 2002

MINUTES

The New Mexico Junior College Board met on Monday, April 15, 2002, beginning at 1:30 p.m. in the Zia Room of Pannell Library. The following members were present: Mr. Monty Newman, Chairman; Mr. Gary Schubert, Secretary; Mr. Larry Hanna; Mrs. Yvonne Williams; Ms. Patricia Chappelle; and Mr. Ferrel Caster. Not present was Mr. John Hice, Jr.

Mr. Newman called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and guests present: Starla Jones, Hobbs News Sun.

Upon a motion by Mr. Caster, seconded by Ms. Chappelle, the agenda was unanimously adopted, as presented.

Upon a motion by Mrs. Williams, seconded by Mr. Hanna, the board unanimously approved the minutes of March 21, 2002.

Under *President's Report*, Dr. McCleery expressed his appreciation to the staff for their hard work during the recent power outage. Maria Vick introduced the cosmetology students who received awards from the recent Skills USA competition. Randy Whicker introduced the automotive students who received the gold, silver, and bronze awards at the same competition. The students will now go to Kansas City for national competition. Dr. McCleery presented awards to Elizabeth Shields and Jonathan Sena for the Phi Theta Kappa All USA Academic Team.

Under *New Business*, Dan Hardin presented the March financial reports and with a motion by Mr. Caster, seconded by Ms. Chappelle, the board unanimously approved the expenditures for March 2002.

Dr. McCleery presented the 2002/2003 fiscal year budget with the recommended changes from the budget work session. Mr. Schubert made a motion to move the Baseball Field Improvements/Renovation to a higher priority in the Capital Project Priorities. Ms. Chappelle seconded the motion. After lengthy discussion, the vote was as follows: Mr. Caster - yes; Ms. Chappelle - no; Mr. Hanna - no; Mrs. Williams - no; and Mr. Schubert - yes. The motion failed.

Upon a motion by Ms. Chappelle, seconded by Mr. Caster, the board approved the budget as presented. The roll call vote was as follows: Mr. Schubert - yes; Mrs. Williams - yes; Mr. Newman - yes; Mr. Caster - yes; Mr. Hanna - yes; and Ms. Chappelle - yes.

Mr. Collins presented RFP #65 - Professional Services for the Development of Components Of An On-Line Licensed Practical Nursing Program. The administration recommended acceptance of the services of IconPower of Boston, MA for \$35,000. Upon a motion by Mr. Schubert, seconded by Mr. Hanna, the board unanimously accepted the recommendation.

Robert Bensing presented a proposal to waive the out-of-district and out-of-state tuition charges for those students who only register for PY101, Introduction to Exercise, at the Del Norte Center plus charge a \$5.00 fee. The result would be that those students who register for this class at Del Norte Center will be assessed a tuition fee of \$26.00, regardless of residency, and a \$5.00 fee. Upon a motion by Mrs. Williams, seconded by Mr. Hanna, the board unanimously approved the proposal.

Richard Fleming presented a request to increase the welding course fee from \$10 to \$20, effective in the fall semester 2002. Upon a motion by Mr. Schubert, seconded by Mrs. Williams, the board unanimously approved the request.

Dr. McCleery presented a retirement resolution for George R. Biggs. Mr. Biggs has served the college for 35 years and has elected to retire the 1st day of July 2002. Upon a motion by Mr. Caster, seconded by Ms. Chappelle, the board unanimously adopted the resolution with regrets.

Personnel Consideration - Professor of Mathematics was tabled.

Mr. Newman called for comments from the community. There being none, the next board meeting was scheduled for May 21, 2002, beginning at 1:30 p.m. in the Zia Room of Pannell Library.

Upon a motion by Mr. Hanna, seconded by Mr. Caster, the board meeting adjourned at 3:05 p.m.

Expenditure and Revenue Reports for April

April represents month ten of the fiscal year or approximately 84% of the budget. The expenditure report represents expenditure totals that include funds expended and encumbered. At the end of April there was \$2,441,561.00 of the expenditures that were encumbered funds. The areas that are above the 84% of budget in Instruction and General are the Academic Support and Student Services. We have reviewed these areas for any departments going over their budgets. As we explained last month, we do not budget fringe benefits into each department, although we charge each department for fringe benefits. Some departments may appear to be over budget due to the fringe benefits, and still be within their budget. Fringe benefits are budgeted in its own department as totals. It appears that all departments should be able to stay within their budgets.

We have reported the last few months that the Internal Service Department, Student Aid, Auxiliary Enterprises, and Athletics are over the projected budget for this time of year. Internal Service Departments include Computer Services, Graphics and Motor Pool. We have reviewed these departments and they will be within their projected budgets for the year, less the fringe benefits. Auxiliary Enterprises include the Bookstore, Housing and Food Services. The Bookstore is above projected expenses and will be over projected expenses at yearend. The cost of goods sold is substantially higher than projected, but is offset by their revenue being much greater than projected. Athletics has expended a large percentage of its budget for grants in aid, but they are projected to stay within their budget.

Restricted student aid is above the projected budget. This area is the Pell Grants and Direct Loans that are draw down funds from the Federal Government.

In the Plant Funds we had very little payment activity for the month of April.

Most other areas in the expense report are in line for this time of year. The over all expenditures through the month of April are at 86% of the projected budget.

The revenue picture has some of the same features as the expenditure report. Tuition and Fees is a seasonal revenue stream. We have received almost all of the Tuition and Fees for the 2001/2002 fiscal year. State appropriations are consistent monthly revenue. Oil and Gas is showing the accrual of \$223,533.00 for April, which is the actual revenue for March. We received \$1,996.00 in oil and gas equipment taxes in April, this makes oil and gas equipment taxes \$450,538.00 over projected revenue. The total oil and gas for the month is \$225,529.00. Property Taxes are at \$1,414,323.00 for the year, we are expecting a large payment in June that should get the revenue up to the projected budget amount. Other revenues, which includes fees and miscellaneous revenue is above projected budget percentage.

Under, Auxiliary Enterprises, the Bookstore revenue has been strong with year to date revenue of \$1,041,081.00.

Grant revenue starts at different times than the fiscal year. Grants normally begin in October and they are a draw down of funds after expenditures have been made. Grant expenditures are higher than the revenue side, but we are seeing the draw downs coming in.

Student Aid consists of work study funds, Pell Grant Program and the Federal Direct Loan program. This is seasonal revenue funded at the start of each semester. Pell Grant program has had draw downs of \$2,396,508.90 and the Direct Loan program is at \$985,285.00.

Total Revenue is ahead of projected budget revenue. In areas of revenue that is not seasonal the monthly income is tracking with or better than projections with the total revenue to budget percentage at 90%.

The month end investment total was \$8,825,000.00 in the Local Government Investment Pool. We have been very fortunate to have good cash flow, but we have a number of capital projects that will require draw downs from the LGIP fund.

The revenue and expenditure position looks good, and we are within our funding budget for 2001/2002 school year.

This is the financial picture for April 2002.

We have submitted the projected budget as required by statute to the Commission on Higher Education. The CHE personnel understand that we will have to make changes to the budget depending on the final funding level approved by the legislature and the Governor.

In order to stabilize the budgetary process for the 2001-02 fiscal year, oil and gas revenues were budgeted at a long-term historical average of \$16.00 per bbl for oil and \$2.50 per mcf for gas. It is recognized that actual collections will exceed this conservative historical average. Therefore, collections for the 2001-02 year that exceed this budgeted amount will be considered for transfer to the college's capital fund at the end of the year.

Item - NMJC # N10587 – Gas Tech Portable H2S Monitor – I have checked with Jerry Brian regarding this piece of equipment and he informed me that it was stolen from an unlocked display case in the hall of the Moran Building. He could not remember the date but he says that security filed a report.

Item – NMJC # N11358 – Panasonic VCR – I was the Director of Allied Health in1997/98 when this item was stolen from the nursing lab and replaced with a VCR that was stolen earlier.

Item – NMJC # 11479 – Re-Circulating Water Kit – Jerry Brian informed me that this was in the back room of the HOWE lab and it ceased to function. It was dismantled and sent for repair and he has no idea whether it was ever returned or not as FaFa left for another position.

The remaining items for which I am responsible have been searched for but I have been unable to find them. Two of them were reported missing before I was hired as the Dean (Panasonic VHS Recorder and Xerox 615 MemoryWriter Typewriter). The remaining item, Resistivity Meter & Case was in the storage room in MB 105 and was used by the Physics classes. All that equipment was moved to Heidel Hall and I think it may have been misplaced during the move. I have not given up on this item.

I hope this memo has provided significant input into the lost inventory issue.

Dear Ms. Nelson:

I have reviewed the Kornegay probate documents you provided. Earl Kornegay's Last Will and Testament established the Kornegay Trust with specific wishes for use of trust funds during the term of the trust, "in the sole discretion of the Trustee." There were insufficient funds to carry out some of the wishes during the term of the trust. The trust's duration was established in paragraph 8 "to continue for a period no longer than the life of my wife, Annie Lee Kornegay,...and twenty-one (21) years thereafter. At the end of such time, the trust estate in its entirety shall be paid over an distributed to the New Mexico Junior College, Hobbs, New Mexico." Mrs. Kornegay died September 19, 1982. The funds must be distributed by September 19, 2003, to New Mexico Junior College.

It is my opinion that the college may use the funds for any lawful purpose at the time of disbursal. The college can transfer the funds to the New Mexico Junior College Foundation whose mission is to foster, encourage and promote college education at New Mexico Junior College. The Kornegay funds could be used to create an endowment with earnings to be used for any purpose that benefits the college. This would be not only legal, but also in my view, consistent with the original intent set out in the Kornegay Last Will an Testament.
