NEW MEXICO JUNIOR COLLEGE BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 21, 2023 MINUTES

The New Mexico Junior College Board met on Thursday, September 21, 2023, beginning at 1:30 p.m. in the Pannell Library, Zia Board Room. The following members were present: Mr. Travis Glenn, Secretary; Mr. Hector Baeza; Ms. Evelyn Rising; Mrs. Erica Jones; Mr. Guy Kesner; and Mr. Manny Gomez. Ms. Patricia Chappelle, Board Chair, was absent.

Mr. Glenn called the meeting to order and welcomed visitors and guests, Ms. Dorothy Fowler, Hobbs News Sun.

Upon a motion by Mr. Gomez, seconded by Ms. Rising, the agenda was unanimously adopted.

Upon a motion by Mr. Gomez, seconded by Ms. Rising, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of August 17, 2023.

Under President's Report Mr. Deron Clark reported the volleyball and cross-country teams are off to a great start and are currently ranked #3 in the nation. Mr. Clark introduced Ms. Kayla Weaver, Assistant Director of Athletics. Ms. Kendalyn Ferguson, Head Women's Golf Coach, introduced the first and new NMJC's Women's Golf Team.

Mr. Scotty Holloman provided an update of new employees and employee retirements/ resignations. Dr. Moore introduced Dr. William Brown, NMJC's new Vice President for Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness, who was in attendance of the meeting. On behalf of the NMJC Board, Mr. Glenn welcomed all new employees to NMJC.

Dr. Moore provided an update of the Staked Plains event held on September 7 and 8, 2023. He reported Staked Plains brought in approximately 500 4th grade students. He thanked the museum and all volunteers who assisted in making the event successful.

Dr. Moore reported the Fearless Concert held on the NMJC campus on Saturday, September 9, 2023 brought in approximately 150 people. He noted this was the first of three concerts. The next two concerts are scheduled to be held on October 14, 2023 and December 2, 2023 at the Lea County Event Center. In addition, he stated proceeds from sale of tickets benefit the United Way of Lea County.

Dr. Moore reported the World Safety Organization (WSO) will host an International Safety & Health Symposium in Odessa, Texas on October 2-4, 2023 with a tour of the NMJC campus on October 4, 2023. Dr. Moore noted WSO is a professional organization whose focus is in environmental and occupational safety. Dr. Moore recognized Ms. Monica Cervantes for working to bring WSO to the area and to the NMJC campus. He noted Ms. Cervantes is a great supporter of NMJC. He further reported WSO is interested in the potential of a Student Chapter on the NMJC campus.

Dr. Moore reported the Council on Accreditation for Two-Year Colleges (CATYC), which works with approximately 19 states of the North Central region and the Higher Learning Commission, will host a conference on October 1 - 3, 2023 in Tempe, AZ. Dr. Moore stated he and Dr. Brown will be in attendance. In addition, Dr. Moore noted he has been approved to serve on the CATYC Executive Committee.

Dr. Moore reported the NMJC President's Council have completed reading the "The Great Upheaval - Higher Education's: Past, Present & Uncertain Future". Under the leadership of 4 group leaders, all groups have completed a presentation of their readings in the President's Council meetings. Next steps for the groups will involve looking at 5 to 6 NMJC values that are associated with NMJC's Mission and Vision and for the strategic planning work which will begin in January, 2024. Dr. Moore noted input from internal/external constituents and the NMJC Board will be included.

Dr. Moore provided an update of NMJC's new Thunderbird Clinic. He reported the final permit has been received and a target date to have the clinic up and running is the end of October, 2023.

Dr. Moore provided an update on his attendance of the Permian Strategic Partnership Reception/Dinner & Discussion on September 13, 2023 with former Florida Governor Jeb Bush as the speaker. Discussions included the East Texas areas and the Southeast New Mexico areas and a Strategic Partnership Plan to make a noticeable change for a good educational system for K-12 and Higher Education. Retention and recruitment to the Permian Basin was another important topic. In addition, NMJC has reached out to the University of Texas Permian Basin in hopes of establishing a partnership and plans to encourage other colleagues and superintendents in Southeast New Mexico to join in this effort.

Dr. Moore stated the advocacy group, New Mexico Independent Community Colleges (NMICC), has recently been in discussions regarding an NMICC Annual Conference in the State of New Mexico. The conference addresses higher education related to how colleges can learn from one another and best practices inside/outside of the classroom. Fellow colleagues have agreed the State of New Mexico needs to have a conference in the spring/fall of 2024. Dr. Moore advised NMJC will seek approval to host the conference on the NMJC campus.

Under Information Items Mr. Glenn provided an update of the Student Success Board Committee that met on August 23, 2023. He reported discussion included the Student Success Board Committee's charge and stated Dr. Moore will begin a draft and provide at the next scheduled board committee meeting. Additional discussions included updates of the new Industrial Training Center, the FY 2022/2023 revenue, students and hours trained, advisory boards that had ceased to meet during COVID have been restored, student data tracking (where are they now?), Lightcast Software updates, status of an Academic Master Plan, and an update of the "Achieving the Dream" report.

Mr. Gomez provided an update of the Facilities Board Committee that met on September 11, 2023. Discussions included the Watson Hall renovation, current status of the installation of Vestibules,

the new Vocational Tech Building, the Thunderbird Clinic, and a new hay/in-door horse barn. In addition, Mr. Gomez noted Mr. Kesner's recommendation for the development of a Concrete Replacement Project Plan.

Mr. Josh Morgan presented the Expenditure Report, Revenue Report, Oil and Gas Revenue Report, and Schedule of Investments Report for August 2023.

Under New Business Mr. Morgan presented a request for approval to transfer funds from I&G to Capital as follows: \$15,000,000 into the NMJC Indoor Athletic Facility; \$2,000,000 into the Central Plant Expansion; \$2,000,000 into the Master Drainage Plan; \$2,000,000 into the Master Landscaping Plan, \$2,000,000 into the Infrastructure Upgrades; and \$2,000,000 into the Equestrian Center. Mr. Morgan stated the identified projects are priority projects in the Campus Facilities Master Plan and/or help to accomplish the Strategic Plan's Mission and Vision of the College. He further clarified this request is not for approval of the projects and noted projects will first be presented to the Facilities Board Committee for discussion and then presented to the NMJC Board for approval. Mr. Glenn asked for clarification of the Central Plant Expansion. Mr. Morgan responded the central plant will require expansion to the west side of the campus for the addition of the new Industrial Training Center and for potential future housing projects. He noted NMJC is working with architects to include the facilities to be located on the west side of the campus into the current Master Plan. Mr. Gomez asked which of the projects presented are not currently in the Master Plan. Mr. Morgan responded the Indoor Athletic Facility is not currently in the Master Plan. He further stated the architects have completed the preliminary review, which will be presented to the Facilities Board Committee for review and discussion. Upon a motion by Mr. Kesner, seconded by Mrs. Jones, the Board unanimously approved the capital transfers as requested.

Mr. Morgan presented a consideration for ITB #1101 - Workers' Compensation Insurance with a recommendation to award the bid to Daniels Insurance, Inc. in a base premium per year amount of \$56,944, which is down from last year in the amount of \$66,697. Mr. Glenn asked why the experience modifier moved up from .74 to .85. Mr. Morgan responded it was a bid year and NMJC moved up to a different tier and noted it was possibly a combination of several factors. Upon a motion by Mr. Baeza, seconded by Mr. Gomez, the Board unanimously approved this request. Mr. Kesner abstained.

Mr. Glenn called for comments from the public. There being none, the next Regular Board Meeting was scheduled for Thursday, October 19, 2023 at 1:30 pm in the Zia Board Room.

Upon a motion by Mr. Kesner, seconded by Mr. Gomez and by unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned at 2:30 pm.

RE: September 2023 Financial Reports

Expenditure Report:

September is the third month or 25% of the 2023/2024 fiscal year. The Expenditure Report represents expenditure totals that include funds expended and encumbered. The total year-to-date funds expended and/or encumbered through the month of September is \$47,286,348.

The total current unrestricted fund expenditures through September are \$11,489,216, which is 28% of the projected budget. Expenses for Instruction and General are higher compared to FY 23 due to the addition of new positions and the implementation of the salary survey approved by the board. In other current unrestricted funds, expenses are also up compared to FY 23 due to the same factors and due to the reclassification of the athletic coaches from faculty to professional employees per the salary survey which resulted in the reclassification of expenditures from I&G to Athletics. Over all, expenditures are up as compared to September 2022.

Restricted fund expenditures through September are \$2,477,270. The expenditures in the grant area is tracking along as expected. The Business Office is monitoring the expenditures in the grants and request the drawdown from the state and federal agencies. In restricted student aid, financial aid payouts have made for the summer and fall semesters. The year-to-date restricted student aid is up compared to FY 23 due to higher enrollment.

Total plant fund expenditures through September are \$33,319,862. Projects with major encumbrances include the Watson Hall Renovation, the Vestibule and Safety Project, the Baseball Field Lighting Project and the Industrial Training Center. Year-to-date building renewal and replacement expenditures are \$443,095 and equipment renewal and replacement expenditures are \$107,285.

Revenue Report:

Total current unrestricted revenue received in September was \$2,724,914. This mostly consists of tuition and fees for the fall semester, the monthly allocation from the state, and the oil and gas production accrual. The oil and gas revenue for September only includes the production

accrual for the month of September and a small portion of equipment tax revenue. We will not begin reporting actual FY 24 production revenue until October. We will not begin receiving property tax revenue for FY 24 until November. Total year-to-date current unrestricted revenue is \$8,250,798.

Total current restricted revenue received in September for grants and student aid was \$207,786. Total year-to-date current restricted revenue is \$2,068,232.

Total plant fund revenue recorded in September is \$1,547,693. This consist of GOB draws for the Vestibule & Safety Project and the Watson Hall Project, STB draws for portable welding trucks, and the LGIP interest. Total year-to-date plant fund revenue is \$3,374,431.

Total revenue for the month of September is \$4,480,393. Total year-to-date revenue is \$13,693,461.

Oil and Gas Revenue Report:

The Oil & Gas Report reflects revenue that is recorded into FY 23. In September, the College received \$5,217,863 in oil & gas revenue for the month of June. This is the last oil & gas revenue to be reported for FY 23. Total oil and gas production and equipment tax revenue for FY 23 is \$89,255,198.

For FY 23, the average monthly oil production was 31,682,689 barrels and the average monthly price per barrel was \$79.60. The average monthly oil production over the last 5 years has increased 126%.

The average monthly gas production was 98,913,372 MCF and the average monthly price per MCF was \$3.91. The average monthly gas production over the last 5 years has increased 155%.

Investment Report:

The College began the month of September with \$210,000,000 invested with the LGIP. There was no activity during the month. Ending balance at the end of September in the LGIP is \$210,000,000. The College earned \$929,135 in interest at a net yield of 5.333% during the month of September.

At the end of September, there was \$210,515,952 in allocated capital projects.

This concludes the financial report for September 2023.

RE: Disposition of Inventory

Pursuant to Article 6 ("Sale of Public Property") Section 13-6-1, New Mexico Junior College is requesting to sell at public auction unused inventory. Upon approval by the NMJC Board of Directors, a letter will be sent to the Office of the State Auditor (OSA) and the Higher Education Department (HED) notifying of our intentions to dispose of such inventory at public auction.
